




HEALTHCARE

CURRENT AIMS:

1. To promote understanding of preventative medicine and strengthen community health literacy.
2. To trial new ways of delivering healthcare in remote regions

PREVIOUS WORK

- Women's health + nutrition talks
- Hygiene workshops (dental/oral/vision)
- Dental screenings + prevention kits
- Eye checks + prescriptions + referrals
- Shadowing doctors at hospitals



IN FUTURE:

- EXPLORING TELEMEDICINE PILOTS (VIRTUAL CONSULTATIONS)
- PREVENTATIVE HEALTH PROJECTS

HOLISTIC WELLBEING

CURRENT AIMS:

1. To promote physical, mental, emotional and social wellbeing in a culturally sensitive way.
2. To use accessible psychology tools to build resilience, coping and connection.

PREVIOUS WORK

- Women's health + nutrition talks
- Weekly personal development sessions
- "Tree of Life" strengths workshop at Tea Leaf Trust
- Teacher training sessions at Tea Leaf Trust in collaboration with Project Roots
- UK-Sri Lanka Pen-Pal Initiative for connection



IN FUTURE:

- Virtual Gym sessions with a boys' home
- Pen-Pal scheme continuation

TECHNOLOGY

CURRENT AIMS:

1. To promote STEM education in Sri Lanka.
2. To use technology to strengthen and scale impact across all other sectors.
3. Empowering organisations to use technology for good and solve community issues.

PREVIOUS WORK

- AI workshops at education centres
- Robotics kits assembly taught and donated to children's homes and a primary school
- Basic IT skills workshops for teachers
- Co-sponsored Dreamshot Makerfaire, an innovation festival in Batticaloa

- Virtual mentorship infrastructure
- Starlink installations

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

CURRENT AIMS:

1. To improve livelihoods and create sustainable economic opportunities for communities.
2. To support communities affected by Cyclone Ditwah and protect wellbeing.

PREVIOUS WORK

- Entrepreneurship / "Apprentice-style" business competition
- Financial literacy programmes for schools and youth communities
- Funded a Shark-Tank style competition at Dreamshot Makerfaire



IN FUTURE:

- Digitised micro-credit project for women-led businesses in the Eastern Province
- Exploring small-business consulting and catalysing local businesses with exporting assistance

EDUCATION

CURRENT AIMS:

1. To strengthen long-term education infrastructure and teaching capacity in underserved communities.
2. Virtual mentorship sessions to plug education gaps for rural /schools orphanages

PREVIOUS WORK

- School Smart-board installation
- Study skills + motivation workshops for students
- Set up / strengthened education departments in partner institutions



IN FUTURE:

- Long-term recovery + development plans for Cyclone Dityah victims
- Expand year-round virtual learning support
- Installing high-speed internet in rural schools
- Piloting a platform for sharing knowledge through webinars + workshops

SPECIAL EDUCATION NEEDS

CURRENT AIMS:

1. Empowering SEN families & professionals to advocate for their children in a culture with high stigma towards SEN children
2. Support the development of multiple SEND homes in areas of need
3. Promote greater inclusivity and expanded education, vocational and social opportunities for SEND people in communities.

PREVIOUS WORK

- Funding blood donation camps and events for HOPE, Trincomalee
- Delivered an empowering and 'life-changing' parent wellbeing and stigma-breaking workshop
- Implemented PECS cards as an accessible communication tool for non-verbal children



IN FUTURE:

- Establish an accredited training programme for SEND staff
